Lieutenant Harry E. Trembath

Harry Trembath was born on September 30, 1916 in Negaunee, Michigan to Richard and Margaret (Trudgeon) Trembath.

He graduated from Negaunee High School in 1934 and was the Senior Class President. Following high school, he attended Northern State Normal School, Georgetown University, and Benjamin Franklin School of Accounting.

He served his country during World War II in the Army Air Corps as a pilot flying B-29s and B-17s.

As a young man, Harry worked in the mines and after the war he worked as a bank examiner with the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

He left his position with the government to become manager of the San Francisco Bay Area Credit Union. In 1964, he accepted a position with Nulaid Foods and not long afterward became president of the company. In 1975, he accepted the presidency of Challenge Dairy Products followed by the position of President of Guild Wineries. His final business challenge was owner and chief executive officer of Aero-Colours.

He died on November 12, 2000 at his home in Danville, California.
